

Donor Dollars Impact Patient Care

Here are a few examples:

- Deep Brain Stimulation (DBS), an innovative treatment for Parkinson's disease, is now available at The Moncton Hospital thanks to donors. The new neurosciences program, the first in New Brunswick, provides life-changing treatment for patients with Parkinson's disease and other movement disorders.
- Thanks to donors, The Moncton Hospital is the first facility in Atlantic Canada and the sixth in Canada to acquire advanced technology for treating patients suffering from ongoing pain due to fibroids. Women now have the option to preserve their uterus as an alternative to undergoing a hysterectomy.
- In collaboration with Wellspring, Canada's leader in evidence-based Cancer Support Programs, free non-medical programs will be rolled out in 2025 to support people living with any type of cancer, at any point on their journey.
- A family-centred Obstetrics and Newborn Care Unit will be opening soon. Our donor contribution, along with the provincial government's, will revolutionize the way care is delivered—providing patients, clients, staff, and physicians with sophisticated technology in a space equipped to provide safe and quality care.

- Construction is underway for a modern **Coronary Care Unit** that will include 8 coronary care beds and
 a 30-bed cardiac/medical unit to benefit patients
 who need treatment for a variety of heart conditions.

- Two modern **Sim Labs** at TMH will allow our health care team to have the appropriate space to practice communication, teamwork, and other skills we use to treat sick patients—everything from routine procedures and delivering babies, to advanced procedures and surgery—ultimately saving lives. **COMING SOON**
- Two 3D Mammography Screening Units are operational in the Katherine Wright Centre to help with early detection of breast cancer. Renovations will be soon underway to house the new 3D Diagnostic Unit for the Imaging Department.
- An area on the Oncology Inpatient Unit has been transformed into a bright, hope-inspiring four-season sunroom and garden space for patients to relax in and heal.
