Donor Dollars Impact Patient Care

Here are a few examples:

- Babies born at The Moncton Hospital are now welcomed in a brand-new, innovative space, thanks to the province and our donors. The Jean Elizabeth Saunders Irving Obstetrics and Newborn Care Unit is an 18-bed space that brings together multiple services under one roof, including labour and birth, Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, antepartum and postpartum care, as well as the Maternal Fetal Medicine Clinic, breastfeeding support, and Postpartum Discharge Clinics.
- Detecting and treating cancer early saves lives. Two donor-funded 3D Mammography Screening Units are in use at the Katherine Wright Centre. We are delighted that the third 3D Diagnostic Unit, located in Medical Imaging, has been in operation since March 17, 2025.
- Deep Brain Stimulation (DBS), an innovative treatment for Parkinson's disease, is now available at The Moncton Hospital thanks to donors. The new neurosciences program, the first in New Brunswick, provides life-changing treatment for patients with Parkinson's disease and other movement disorders.

- Renovations to Bannon House are expected to be completed in late fall. This space will become a unique hub for cancer patients to gather, connect with peers, find strength, and attend programs that foster wellness.
 Programs will be at no cost and open to anyone at any stage of their cancer journey.
- Construction is well underway for a modern Coronary Care Unit that will include 8 coronary care beds and a 30-bed cardiac/medical unit to benefit patients who need treatment for a variety of heart conditions.

- Two modern Sim Labs at TMH will allow our health care team to have the appropriate space to practice communication, teamwork, and other skills we use to treat sick patients—everything from routine procedures and delivering babies, to advanced procedures and surgery—ultimately saving lives.
